Executive Summary

The year 2023-2024 was a successful one for Southwest Virginia Community College. SWCC saw increases in enrollment, high graduation rates and good retention rates. Hyflex was expanded to meet the needs of students who wanted both in person and online options. More hyflex classrooms were added in response to faculty and student demand.

ADMISSIONS—Fall Semester application yield increased to 55.34%, a 21.92% difference over the prior fall. The data for Spring Semester also indicated a 16.97% increase. SWCC still has not met the 60% applied and enrolled benchmark, however, Fall 23 and Spring 24 numbers are promising and indicate movement in a positive direction. The VCCS and SWCC are still dealing with bogus applications and registrations in fraudulent attempts to receive financial aid, but the numbers seem to indicate the new authentication process at the system office is functioning better than the method used in 2022-23.

ENROLLMENT—Full Time Equivalent-- Overall FTE was up in summer, fall, and spring semesters. Term FTE increased by 11.7% in summer, 6.9% in fall, and 11.8% in the spring. Annual FTE increased by 9.6%. For summer (7.21 credits), fall (11.41 Credits), and spring (10.94 credits) semesters SWCC was first in the VCCS in 23-24 for highest average number of credit hours taken by students.

ENROLLMENT— Headcount increased in all three semesters, with a minimum increase of 5.78% in fall and the maximum increase of 11.6% in summer. Spring was not far behind with an increase in headcount of 10.52%. Enrollment patterns continued to be consistent—more women than men; most students less than 24 years old, and more majority than minority.

ENROLLMENT-Academic Year—Headcount increased by 8.7% and FTE increased by 9.6%.

FIRST GENERATION COLLEGE-- The percentage of first-generation college students increased in the summer (by 13.29%), fall (by 17.39%), the spring (by 18.74%) and annually (by 13.21%). SWCC had the second highest percentage of first-generation students in the VCCS. As defined by the VCCS, *First Generation Students are those with both parents who had no postsecondary education*. It should be noted that the VCCS has improved the system for counting FGC students, which could account for some of the increase.

DUAL ENROLLMENT—Dual enrollment headcount increased in both fall and spring. The program accounted for 23% of the annual headcount and 16% of the annual FTEs. These percentages have not significantly increased over the prior year.

REGISTRATION — Average grades for fall were lower than those for spring as is typical. Drop counts were higher in 2023-24 but that could be attributed to a change in source. There were 50 fewer course withdrawals than in the prior year. Students completed 84.4% of overall credits attempted.

TEN MOST POPULAR PROGRAMS— Education, Licensed Practical Nursing, Psychology, and Business Administration fell from the top ten plan list in 2023-24. These were replaced by the Medical Coding Certificate, Mental Health AAS, Information Systems Technology AAS, and Business Management AAS. The programs with the highest growth in the top ten were Information Systems Technology, Mental Health, Business Management and Medical Coding. Still in the top ten but with a negative change in enrollment are Science Pre-Medical, Emergency Medical Services Technology, and Nursing.

STUDENTS BY ACADEMIC PLAN— The program with the highest percentage of fulltime students was Liberal Arts with 77% fulltime students. Nine plans with HC>10 were 90% or greater female (OTA AAS, Substance Abuse AAS, Phlebotomy CSC, Medical Coding Cert, Early Childhood Development AAS, Early Childhood Education CSC, Pharmacy Tech CSC, Early Childhood Infant and Toddler CSC, Human Service Cert). Five plans with HC>10 were 90% or greater male (Welding Diploma, HVAC Cert, Electrical CSC, Electrical/Electronics AAS, welding CSC). Eight programs with HC>10 had minority enrollments 20% or greater minority students (Electrical CSC, General Studies AS, Engineering AS, Cybersecurity CSC, Business Administration AS, Science AS, Personal Satisfaction, Transient).

FINANCIAL AID— The amount of aid disbursed from all sources was \$10,577,217.87. This is a \$1,959,773.76 increase over 2022-23. Of the students enrolled in financial aid eligible programs, 78% received some type of financial aid through grants, private loans or scholarships. The overall average award increased by \$567.00 over the prior year, while county funded and private loan average awards decreased.

CLASS UTILIZATION— Class utilization increased by 5.18% in Fall 2023. HyFlex sections increased by 1.61%; hybrid decreased by 3.91%; virtual decreased by 2.98%. The number of in person sections remained the same at ~32%.

RETENTION— This student success retention target is that SWCC will improve both Fall to Spring and Fall to Fall Retention rate by 2% each year. Though fall to spring retention rates are high, the rates fail to meet the target by only 0.18%. The data for fall to fall retention is incomplete due to ongoing registration for the 7W2 session, but tentatively could meet the threshold of a 2% increase (currently at 3.35% increase).

DEGREES-- 481 graduates received 654 awards in 2023-24. Sixty-nine more degrees were awarded this year. More females attained degrees than males (320;161). The service area county with the most graduates was Tazewell with 183 graduates receiving awards. Totals for other service area counties were as follows: Russell County-117; Buchanan County-92; Dickenson County-14. Twenty-three students from out of state received degrees also. Of those receiving degrees, 5% were minorities.

GRADUATION RATES-- Note: SWCC chose the IPEDS overall graduation rate as its student success indicator for SACSCOC in 2018. At that time the rate was 33%. The data above indicates 11% improvement over that baseline. This upswing might be attributed to more intrusive advising or clearer graduation pathways set by our pathways project and the overall objectives of a Title III grant. The College also set the target for this

student success indicator at 3% improvement over the prior year. This target was not met for 2023-24. The prior year's rate was also 44%. Of the 44% of the cohort that finished within 150%, 61% were female, 39% were male and 3% were minorities.

DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION-- This is the fourth report for the new co-requisite developmental model. In Fall 2020, students were placed using direct placement methods and were co-enrolled in support courses in English (English Direct Enrollment-EDE) and Mathematics (Mathematics Direct Enrollment-MDE) when needed. In Fall of 2023 the number of students in developmental courses increased by 25 in EDE and by 10 in MDE. The success rate in both courses increased significantly (29% in EDE; 18% in MDE).

PARTICIPATION RATES-- SWCC has one of the highest participation rates in the VCCS. Dickenson County is split between SWCC and MECC with SWCC (13%) getting fewer of the county students due to proximity. SWCC is the first choice for most students in Buchanan (70%), Russell (60%) and Tazewell (62%) Counties. Overall, of the 2,811 students attending college in the fall of 2023, 63% chose to attend SWCC. This rate was the same in 2022.

SUCCESS AND PLACEMENT RATES FOR PROGRAMS REQUIRING LICENSURE—SWCC has six programs that require board passage and licensure prior to employment in field. Data is updated based on graduation and test dates. At this time only Registered Nursing had complete data with 95% passing boards and receiving licensure.

WORKFORCE CREDENTIALS-- The success target for this student achievement indicator is to identify other recognized workforce credentials and track those awards, increasing the number of awards each year by 3%. In 2023-2024 that number earned increased by 12.82% (1,022 in 22-23;1,153 in 23-24).

TRANSFER— One hundred twelve students transferred to four year institutions in 2022-23. Of those transfers, 83 attended public institutions and 35 attended private institutions. This data does not give a complete picture of transfers from Southwest for several reasons. First, out of state schools are not reported and due to the proximity of several out of state institutions the number of actual transfers is under-reported. Also, Southwest has transfer agreements with Lincoln Memorial University and East Tennessee State University in Tennessee, the University of Pikeville and Lindsay Wilson College in Kentucky, and the Appalachian School of Pharmacy in Virginia. None of these transfers are reported by SCHEV.

GRADE DISTRIBUTION— Seventeen percent of grades in the period studied were D, F or W. In 2022-23 the number was than 15%. Subject areas with a DFWU rate of 30% or greater are AGR, RPK, PHI, MDE, EDE, MDL, BIO, ACC, and EDU (number of grades greater than 10). Individual courses with a DFWU rate of 30% or greater are highlighted in pink on the <u>Annualized Grade Distribution by Subject and Course 2023-2024</u> chart.

GPA and CREDITS PER PLAN— Annual average term gpa is 2.94; average cumulative gpa is 3.03. Students took an average of 7.65 credits per term and the average number of cumulative credits was 30.

POST GRADUATION WAGES— Post graduation wages have increased over the reported period. Within 18 months of graduation the median income for 2020-21 graduates increased by \$2,320. For those who graduated in 2001-02 that median income increase was \$6,619. Wages in 2022 for 2020-21 Grads ranged from a low of \$11,392 at the 10th Percentile to a high of \$66,919 at the 90th Percentile. That number increases significantly as graduates stay in the workforce. For example, 2001-02 graduates earned \$24,924 at the 10th Percentile and \$116,209 at the 90th Percentile. Eighty percent of reported wages for all groups fall within the 10th and 90th percentiles.




Student Transfers



As reminder, the median value represents the very middle value of the sample of values (wage or debt) sorted from low to high. This value is found in the middle line of the barcharts.

The remaining values in the chart are constructed similarly, to display how wages and samings are distributed. Thus, while the median tells us the middle wage, the values for the 25th and 75th percentiles tell us that half of the graduates with wages fall between these two values. Likewise, 80% of reported wages fall between the 10th and 90th percentiles. The length of each bet section clue to the dispersion in the data - that is, how much samiles can vary within a range a group of individuals.

Notes: Post graduation wages have increased over the reported period. Within 18 months of graduation the median income for 2020-21 graduates increased by \$2,320. For those who graduated in 2001-02 that median income increase was \$6,619. Wages in 2022 for 2020-21 Grads ranged from a low of \$11,392 at the 10th Percentile to a high of \$66,919 at the 90th Percentile. That number increases significantly as graduates stay in the workforce. For example, 2001-02 graduates earned \$24,924 at the 10th Percentile and \$116,209 at the 90th Percentile. Eighty percent of reported wages for all groups fall within the 10th and 90th percentiles.
