Dear College Community Members,

The Annual Security Report (ASR) is now available on the <u>Annual Security Report page</u> of the Southwest Virginia Community <u>College website</u>. This report, a comprehensive document, outlines internal and external resources available to the community as a whole and provides specific information to help keep you safe and informed.

Pursuant to federal law, all current employees (Faculty and Staff) and currently enrolled students of Southwest Virginia Community College are notified via e-mail by October 1st each year with a link to the ASR. Additionally, the report has been made accessible to all prospective students and employees. The ASR contains crime statistics about certain specified crimes/incidents that have been reported to the SWCC Campus Police, Campus Security Authorities (CSA), Human Resources, Title IX Coordinator, Emergency Coordination Officer, SWCC Threat Assessment Team, or our local/state law enforcement partners over the past three years that have occurred either on campus, in off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by the College, or on public property adjacent to campus.

This report focuses on College programs, properties and facilities owned or controlled by the College. Southwest Virginia Community College has off-site locations in Tazewell County (Bluefield Center), Buchanan County (Southern Gap Transportation and Logistics Center), and Russell County (Lebanon Center for Education and Training). Crime statistics are also available on the Annual Security Report page.

The ASR encourages the reporting of all crimes and explains how and to whom to report crimes. In addition, with the ASR being made available online, prospective students and College employees can review it at any time. There is no charge for this or past reports. Any questions regarding this report should be directed to the SWCC Chief of Police or the Dean of Student Success.
